He is going to get a permanent home ready for his disciples and in due course he will come for them. His return to God will bring new power in action, new certainty in prayer. And, as he continues to say, his followers will have a helper, the Holy Spirit will come to be with them always and everywhere, and Jesus' own unspeakable peace will be theirs.
