

SERVICE FOR SUNDAY NOVEMBER 4th 2018 and notices for the coming week

Next Sunday is Remembrance Day with Godalming's Act of Remembrance taking place, as normal, in the Phillips Memorial Ground at the War Memorial but this year extended to incorporate parts of the National Commemoration of 100 years since the end of World War 1. As has been the practice in recent years there will be no service at GUC, rather we will join the rest of Godalming for the service at the War Memorial. Godalming Town Council are planning for attendance of up to 1,000 people.

The arrangements for this year's service at the War Memorial will therefore be both local and national and have therefore required some change in the normal timings. For those on the full parade it will be a long day starting at 8.50am and continuing until noon. Brief details are as follows:

- -9.00am, the abbreviated parade will leave the Council Car Park
- -9.45am- 10.30am, service in the Parish Church
- -10.30am, the Act of Remembrance moves to the War Memorial.

The full parade will proceed from the Church down Borough Road to the War Memorial. Public access to the War Memorial will be from the Bowling Green end. There will be no access to the higher ground behind the War Memorial, only access for the colours and standards. It is expected that the public will start to congregate from 10am. The remembrance service will include the dedication pf the new War Memorial plaques which will include those names previously missing.

- -11am, the service will be as normal but include the tolling of the Parish Church bell as part of the National Remembrance. After this wreaths will be laid. If individuals wish to lay personal wreaths (not crosses), that will be possible as part of the service. The service will end with the National Anthem and the full parade will form up in Borough Road and march along the High Street (and then through Crown Court Car Park) with the Mayor taking the salute at Angel Court. Only at the end of the parade in the Council Car Park will children be able to be collected by parents etc.
- -12.30pm, the National Peal will be rung from the Parish Church as part of the three peals to be rung across the country during the day.

As in previous years we have been asked to steward the event. I hope that those of you who have helped in the past will do so again. Given the expected large attendance additional volunteers would be a bonus- please tell me if you can help.
